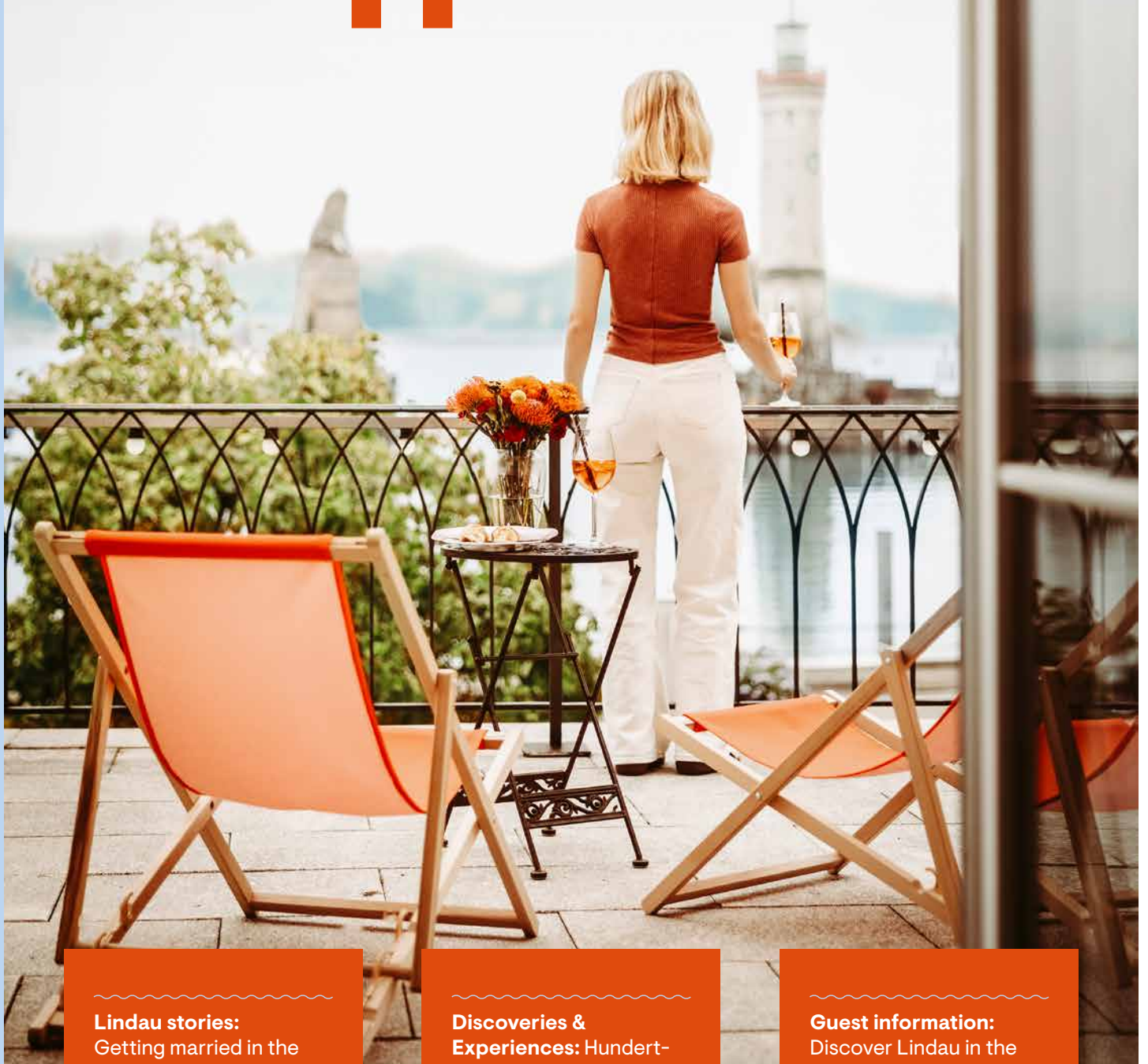

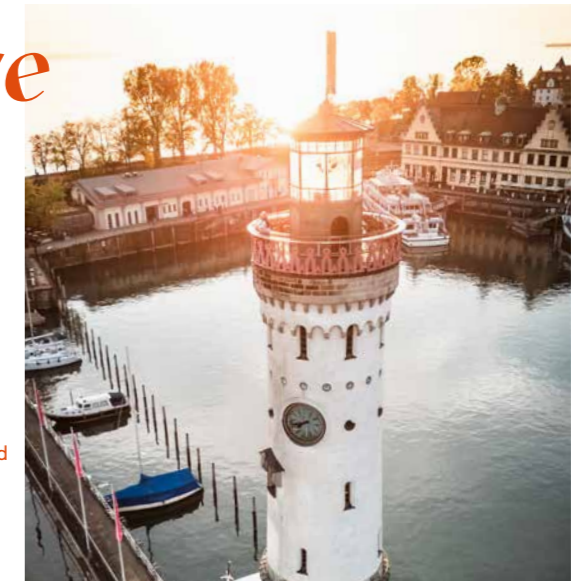
## New Lighthouse

## 9am *Breakfast*

Recharge your batteries in between with coffee and cake – or on the weekend with a freshly baked Dinnete, a type of local pizza, at the cosy **Café Collodium**.



## 6pm *Dinner*

In the evening you can indulge in fine dining in one of Lindau's numerous restaurants, perhaps at **KARRisma** on Alter Schulplatz, which has Michelin-starred cuisine with particular emphasis on regional produce, or with local specialties in the hidden beer garden at **Wissingers im Schlechterbräu**. Afterwards, you could visit a performance of the marionette opera, which is known for its intricate style of puppetry. Or end the day with a drink at **Schützingers am See** on the south-western side of the island, with a perfect view of the setting sun.

*The name 'Cavazzen' hints at the Italian influence found in what's perhaps the most beautiful baroque town house on Lake Constance. In fact, the house name refers to the inhabitants of a previous building on the site, who came from Lombardy. The current building was built to the instructions of Johann Michael Seutter von Loetzen, a Swabian nobleman and successful merchant, who had the building erected in late baroque style after a city fire in 1729. For three centuries, the merchant family Seutter von Loetzen traded, stored and lived in the 'Haus zum Cavazzen' on Lindau's market square, until it was acquired by the industrialist Ludwig Kick and donated to the city of Lindau as a location for the city museum.*



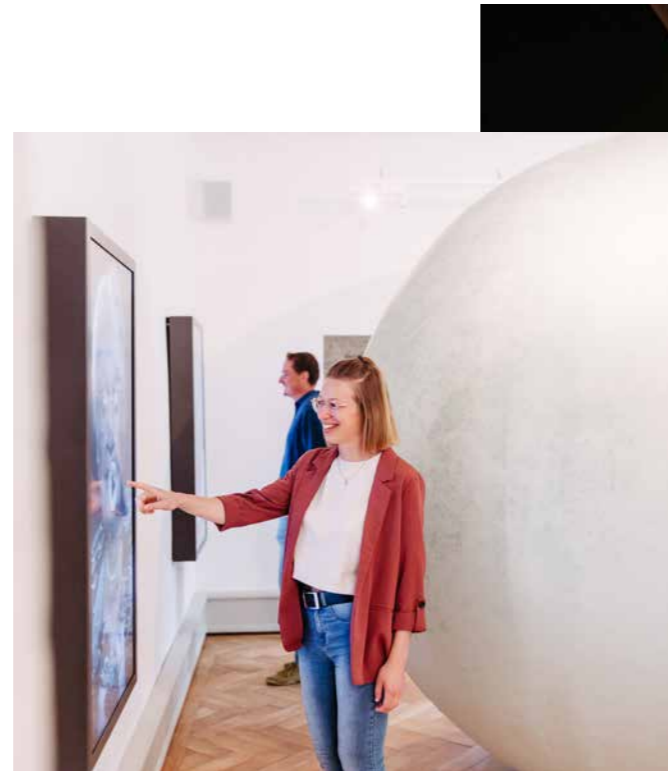
### Renovation of a historic site

Even the most beautiful of buildings are not spared the ravages of time. By the beginning of the new millennium, the defects had become more noticeable, the structure more fragile and the foundations more unstable. Money was required for the renovations, and also, awareness needed to be drawn to this unique architectural monument, which is of national importance. Major art exhibitions brought the Cavazzen to the attention of politicians from 2011 onwards. Thanks to generous funding from the German Parliament, the European Union, the Free State of Bavaria as well as many others, the renovation of this baroque jewel could finally be approved. 'It was a once-in-a-century opportunity to receive such great support for the Cavazzen project – from politicians as well as from the local citizens, and the specially founded organisation for patrons', explains Alexander Warmbrunn, head of the Lindau Cultural Office.

From 2020 to 2025, the baroque nobleman's house was renovated inside and out – from the foundations to the massive, free-standing roof truss. Since its reopening, the Cavazzen shines again in new splendour and gives an idea of the impression it must have made at the time of its construction. With the return of the permanent exhibition on Lindau's history with a modern exhibition concept, the Cavazzen is now far more than a museum: it is a place of dialogue, inspiration and discovery that brings to life Lindau's journey through time in an innovative way. 'The Cavazzen itself is our most important exhibit,' affirms museum director Barbara Reil: 'It is a gift for our museum that we can illustrate significant aspects of Lindau's history, such as the cross-border exchange of goods and ideas, or the influence of proud citizens, by using this building.'

### Where history comes alive

From its origins as a former private house, the Cavazzen has now become a 'citizens' palace', thanks to the renovations supported by the town's populace, and it being designed for them and their guests. It has become a lively meeting place for visitors of all ages. On the ground floor, an open, inviting space awaits guests – freely accessible and designed for everyone interested in history, culture, and socialising. Here you learn not only interesting facts about the fascinating history of the building, which has shaped the townscape for centuries, but also experience the 'Town Square in the Cavazzen' as a place to linger, meet, and be inspired. The central ticket office, cloakrooms and a well-stocked museum shop are also located on the ground floor.



On the upper floors, the history of Lindau unfolds through three exhibits, designed in accordance with the latest museum standards to be multimedia-based, interactive and lively. Visitors can experience Lindau's past as an imperial and trading city by travelling to Italy with the Lindau Messenger courier service for example. The changes brought about by the building of the railway, and industrialisation, as well as the town's response to the challenges of the 20th and 21st centuries, are vividly and comprehensibly presented. A special highlight is the 'time machine' in the media room, which takes visitors on a journey through the centuries in a few minutes. On a large projection screen, a vivid panoramic picture of the city of Lindau unfolds, from its origins as a medieval trading centre to a modern cultural region. Animated scenes, music, voices and light merge into an immersive audiovisual experience that captivates both children and adults and brings history to life.

Another architectural gem awaits visitors at the very top of the house: the historic roof truss of the Cavazzen with its impressive wooden construction, which has been restored with great craftsmanship. With a breathtaking view over the roofs of Lindau to Lake Constance, it is the crowning glory to a visit to the museum, and opens up new perspectives on the town and its history.

### Ristobar Cavazzo

Nowhere else in Lindau is more Mediterranean than in the courtyard of Cavazzo. With its walls in delicate shades of pink and orange, you immediately feel like you're on holiday. The perfect place for a little more 'Bella Italia' in Lindau is to be found in the Ristobar Cavazzo. A museum café and a place for southern-European-influenced dishes, you will find not only fine cakes here, and coffee specialties using our own roasted beans, but also freshly prepared dishes with an Italian-Mediterranean touch: from light antipasti and tapas to hearty pasta dishes and creative salads. Add a sunny aperitif or a glass of wine, and the dolce vita is perfect!

The curators, Prof. Dr. Roland Doschka and Dr. Sophie Sümmermann, have opted for an evocative, dialogical presentation that casts a fresh look at Picasso and highlights connections between the works. Thanks to the curators' intensive efforts, in addition to significant loans from museums, works from private collections are also on display, which would otherwise not be accessible to the public. This special exhibition thus offers a unique chance to rediscover the artist of the century, Picasso, as a draftsman, designer and free spirit, whose inexhaustible creativity remains alive in every stroke, every line and every ceramic piece.

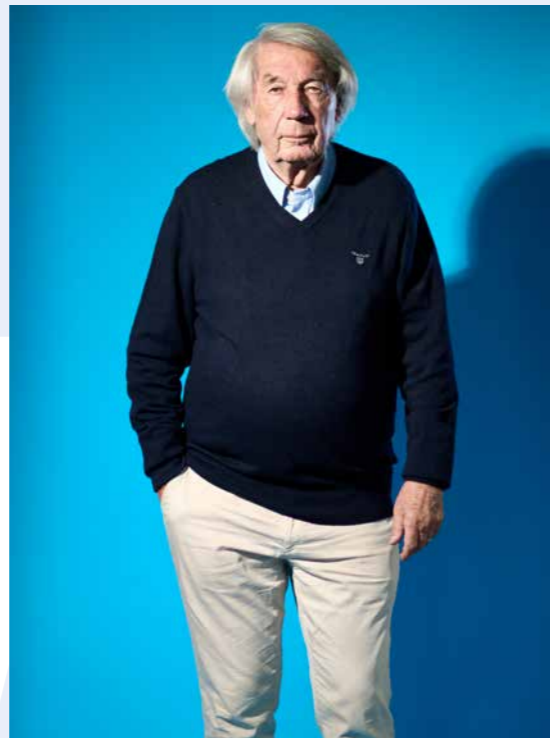
For Lindau, the special exhibition 'Handmade – Master Drawings and Ceramics' is also a kind of homecoming: a major Picasso show was presented here back in 2011, curated at that time by Roland Doschka, just like a dozen other exhibitions on Classical Modernism in collaboration with cultural office director Alexander Warmbrunn. Altogether, the exhibitions have attracted over a million visitors.

How fortunate for Lindau that, thanks to the special exhibitions, we can once again experience the Cavazzen again today in all its magnificence, or to put it in the words of Florian Seutter von Loetzen, a direct descendant of the builder: 'Wow, it has turned out beautifully!'

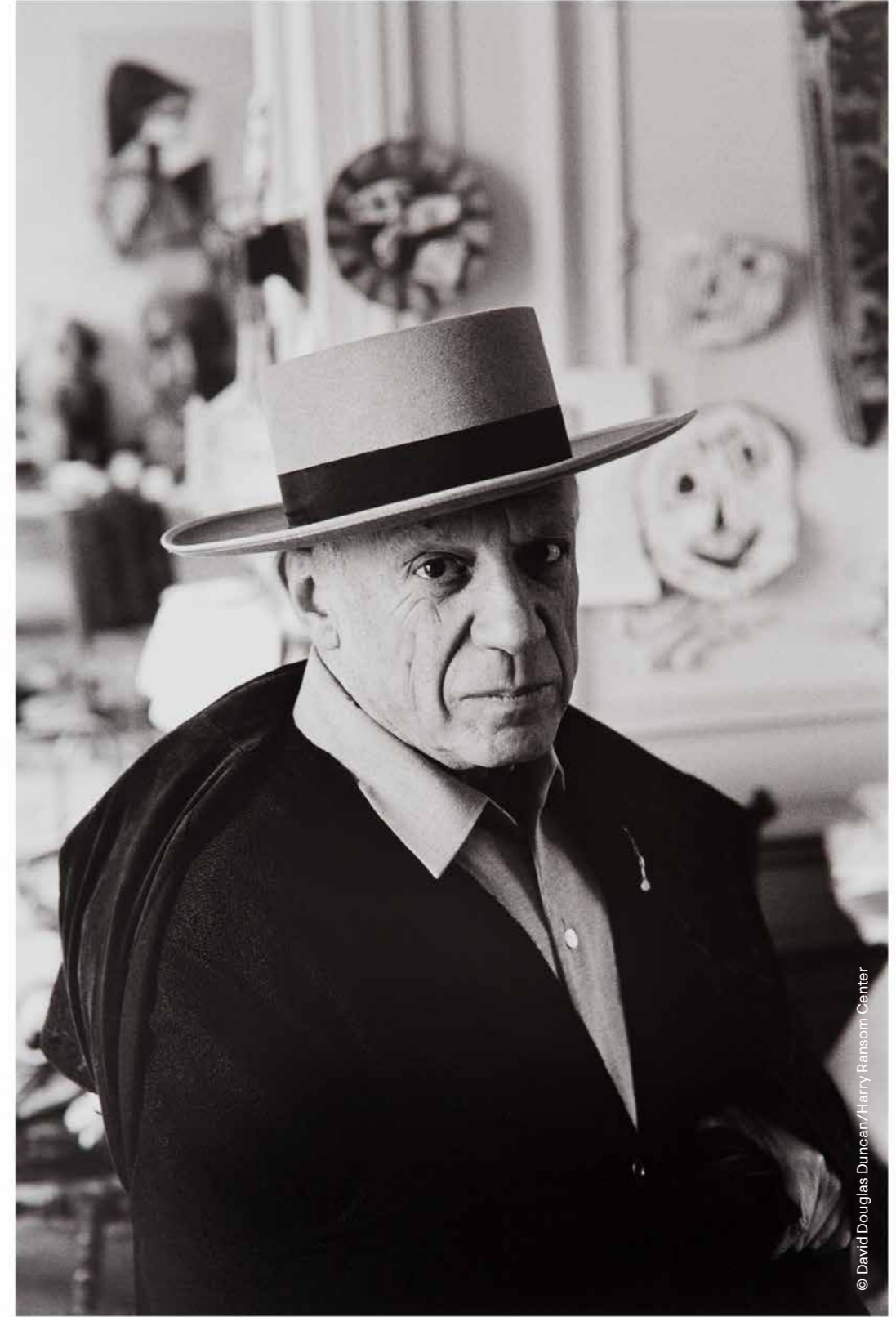
### Special Picasso Exhibition

In addition to the lively presentation of the town's history, the special exhibitions of classical modern art, which have been established for several years now, are also returning to the newly designed rooms of the Cavazzen. The first of these, starting on 2nd May 2026, is a very special highlight: the exhibition 'PICASSO.HANDMADE – Master Drawings and Ceramics' which presents a very special chapter of the life's work of Pablo Picasso. Around 60 items – carefully selected drawings and ceramic objects – provide a rare insight into two areas of work that accompanied Picasso throughout his life and yet often stand in the shadow of his painting.

The central element of these very different media is the line – whether drawn with a pencil on paper or painted with a brush on clay. The drawings predominantly originate from Picasso's later creative phases, in which he devoted himself to drawing with great freedom and immediacy. The ceramics – formed, painted and coloured by hand – are mostly unique pieces in which his artistic imagination combines with the haptic qualities of the material. Photographs by David Douglas Duncan provide an additional insight into Picasso's life and his studio.

# 75 Years of Excellence

Once a year, Lindau becomes the meeting point for the international scientific elite. For the last 75 years, the island town has been the venue for the Lindau Nobel Laureate Meetings, gathering Laureates and young researchers from all over the world.

## History of the Nobel Laureate Meetings

The idea came from two Lindau doctors, Franz Karl Hein and Gustav Wilhelm Parade. They recognised the problem that had arisen from the isolation of the German scientific community after the Second World War, and wanted to address this with a conference that would bring international scientists together. The goal, besides scientific exchange, was also reconciliation and mutual inspiration. With the support of Count Lennart Bernadotte af Wisborg, Lord of the island of Mainau and member of the Swedish royal family, seven Nobel Laureates from the fields of physiology and medicine were invited to speak at the first meeting in 1951. Four hundred scientists came to Lindau to not only exchange research findings, but also to make new contacts and overcome boundaries.

Shortly thereafter, Board of Trustees President Count Lennart Bernadotte expanded the idea of a dialogue between nations and disciplines. He wanted to extend the exchange across generations and suggested, in particular, inviting young researchers to the meetings. Today, more than 600 young scientists from over 200 academic partners from around the world gather in Lindau every year, to exchange ideas with Nobel Laureates of their discipline, to discuss their research projects and to build valuable networks. For about a week each summer, they enjoy the now famous 'Lindau Spirit': the special atmosphere, the sense of community and the opportunity to focus entirely on science for a few days.

In addition to lectures by the 30 to 40 participating Nobel Laureates, panel discussions and rounds of open talks, the programme also includes 'Laureate Lunches' for the young researchers, where they can exchange ideas with the distinguished luminaries in a relaxed atmosphere. If you happen to be in Lindau during the week of the Nobel Laureate Meeting, you may well see smaller groups of young scientists walking across the island together with Nobel Laureates. The 'Science Walks' move the discussion about scientific questions into the fresh air.

## Mainau and the Bernadottes

Even though the focus of the meetings changes each year between the Nobel Prize disciplines of chemistry, physics and physiology/medicine, one item on the programme has remained unchanged since the first Nobel Laureate Meeting. On the last day, a boat takes participants to the island of Mainau, where the event concludes with a shared picnic in the park. However, instead of Count Lennart, the conference participants are now welcomed by his daughter,

Countess Bettina Bernadotte, who not only lives on Mainau, but is also President of the Board of Trustees for the Lindau Nobel Laureate Meetings. The visit to the flower island has also been used three times by the attending Nobel Laureates for the joint signing of the so-called Mainau Declarations, which spoke out against the use of nuclear weapons (in 1955 and again in 2024) and for stronger climate protection (2015).

## Tribute to the Laureates

Which Nobel Laureates have actually been to Lindau? You can find out easily by visiting the Nobel Prize winners' jetty at the Kleiner See, near the Inselhalle. All Nobel Prize winners who have attended the Lindau Nobel Laureate Meetings since 1951 are immortalised on the struts of the railing. In total, over 400 names can be seen, predominantly, of course, scientists from the fields of physics, chemistry and medicine, such as Niels Bohr, Max Born, Otto Hahn, Werner Heisenberg, Konrad Lorenz, or Rita Levi-Montalcini. However, winners of the Peace, Literature or Economics Nobel Prizes such as John F. Nash Jr., Joseph Stiglitz, Mario Vargas Llosa, Muhammad Yunus or Willy Brandt, have also been guests in Lindau.

## Science and Responsibility

The visit of Albert Schweitzer in 1954 caused quite a stir, as he was the first Nobel Peace Prize Laureate to participate in the meeting. His exchange with Otto Hahn and Werner Heisenberg led to a reflection on the social responsibility of science, which is still part of the 'Lindau Spirit' today, and not only demonstrated in the Mainau Declarations.

For the anniversary year of 2026, under the motto '75 Years and Beyond – Science that Transcends Borders' numerous Nobel Laureates are expected for their annual 'class reunion' in Lindau once again, and no doubt there will be one or two new names added to the Nobel Prize winners' jetty!

How old is the universe? How does plant-growth work? And what is light, actually? For all those interested in the answers to these, and other exciting questions from science and research, the Lindau Nobel Laureate Meetings have created a special knowledge trail together with the town of Lindau. At 18 stations on Lindau island and 3 more on the mainland (as well as 3 stations on the island of Mainau), knowledge pylons can be found. These explain in an easy-to-understand way scientific discoveries that have been awarded the Nobel Prize and show how they are related to our everyday lives.

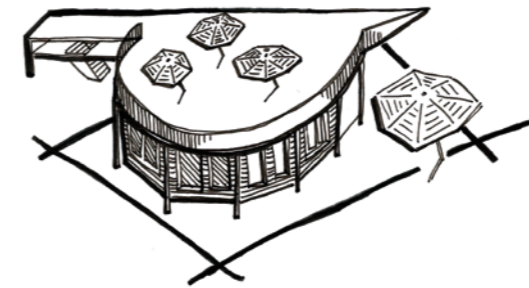

# *La dolce vita* *in* **Lindi**



*Located at the heart of the Bavarian Riviera, the freely accessible bathing area in Lindenhofpark can rightly be described as Lindau's 'spiaggia libera'. With its stately villas, Mediterranean flair and view of the blue waves of Lake Constance, you almost feel as if you're in Italy, and since 2014, the 'Lindi' has been providing even more of the 'dolce vita'.*

### A bathing resort rich in tradition

Opened in the 1950's, the Lindenhof bathing resort, with its iconic architecture, is a true Lindau institution. Every summer, locals and guests relax in the shade of the mighty trees in the park, bathe in the clear water or indulge in the most popular lido snack: a bag of fries.

It's hard to believe that this spot on the shores of Lake Constance, which is so popular today, lay dormant just a decade ago. It was brought back to life with Lindau council's decision to turn the lido, which required an entrance fee, into a freely accessible bathing area and to entrust Timm Stade with the running of the beach café. The Lindau native took on the 'Lindi' project in 2014, and since then, he has enthusiastically pursued his goal of revitalising this special location and developing it into the attraction it is today. 'We really had to start from scratch back then. There was so much to do, to repair, to maintain and to beautify. But step by step, together with the town of Lindau, we managed to restore this gem to its former glory', says Timm Stade, who runs the 'Lindi' together with Joe Friesacher.

### Renovation brings a new lease of life

At the centre of the complex stands the pavilion, built in 1959, which houses a kiosk, catering facilities, changing rooms and more. With its sweeping curves, clear lines and airy galleries, it is a real gem of 1950's architecture and, like the entire ensemble, is a listed building. Since the renovation of the exterior walls last year, the horseshoe-shaped building now shines again in its original bright colours. 'It wasn't so easy to find the right shades of paint, as only black-and-white photographs exist from the early years. Sometimes we had to scrape off old layers of paint to determine the original colour scheme', explains the 'Lindi' proprietor. The decorative elements on the railing in front of the terrace on the upper floor add bold splashes of colour: red, blue and yellow fish, as well as snails, provide a cheerful lightness.

### The Lindenhofpark in the immediate vicinity

Another special feature of the 'Lindi' is its location on the edge of Lindenhof Park, one of the most attractive parks in Southern Germany. The seven-and-a-half hectare landscaped garden was laid out in the 1840's on behalf of the Lindau merchant, Friedrich Gruber, and surrounds the stately Villa Lindenhof which he built. In 1956, the ensemble passed into the possession of the town of Lindau. The east wing of the Villa Lindenhof now houses the 'friedens räume' peace museum, while the protected garden of the Lindenhof Park is now open to all who appreciate its unique beauty.



'This dreamlike location on the shore of Lake Constance, with the shade of the huge old trees of Lindenhof Park, is what has inspired me about the 'Lindi' from the very beginning,' enthuses Timm Stade. 'Turning this magnificent place into a location that makes people happy, that offers them relaxation and enjoyment, was, and is, a true labour of love.' The colourful mosaic of towels on the sunbathing lawn, as well as the satisfaction of the guests, are proof that he has succeeded.

### More than just a lido

From about late March to mid-October, guests can enjoy the relaxed atmosphere of the 'Lindi'. At the heart of it is, of course, the food and drink on offer. In addition to the usual beer garden and lido classics, the menu also features delicious cakes, apple strudel or iced coffee. To quench your thirst, there are lemonades and beers from nearby Allgäu, or wine from the Lindau winery, Haug.

Timm Stade knows, from taking part in the 1992 Olympics as a windsurfer, that it's all about commitment, precision and perseverance. Today, he transfers this sporting ambition to his beach café 'Lindi'. 'Our approach is always to think from the guest's perspective. What do we have to do so that our guests have a fun and relaxed time here?' explains Timm Stade.

The 'Lindi' has more to offer than just a well-maintained, free bathing area. Why not rent a kayak or SUP board and drift on Lake Constance? Or browse the adjoining shop for casual swimwear or original souvenirs? Regularly held music events with internationally renowned artists provide an extra special atmosphere, and anyone who gets to enjoy the magnificent view of the lake from the upper floor terrace, with an aperitif in their hand, will appreciate why it almost feels like being in Italy, and at any rate, close to paradise here.

For an exclusive 'Lindi' experience, the beach club is available right on the lake shore. Here, groups of 25 to 45 people can meet or celebrate, regardless of the weather and with a magnificent view of Lake Constance and the Alps. The panoramic window front, which can be fully opened towards the lake, and a private outdoor area make it extra special.

# Paper Treasures

The lower floor of the Old Town Hall, formerly a market hall, conceals a cultural gem: the former imperial city library. With its 13,000 historic volumes, it is a significant testimony to Lindau's history and offers fascinating insights into the intellectual development of Europe since the Reformation.

Founded in 1538 on the initiative of dedicated Lindau citizens who were enthusiastic about humanism and Protestantism, it is a true child of the Reformation era. The core of the collection comes from secularised monastery libraries, as evidenced by the oldest book in the collection, a collection of psalms from the early 14th century. At the same time, the imperial city of Lindau committed itself to purchasing new works worth 24 guilders annually.

'The focus was on the interests and needs of the library's main users: priests, local lawyers, teachers and other scholars,' explains the Lindau library director Markus Breitwieser. Through purchases and donations, an extensive collection was built up over the centuries, of works from the fields of theology and classical philology, history and law, geography and natural sciences, as well as astronomy and medicine. That we can still admire bibliophilic treasures like a coloured Luther Bible from 1534, the World Chronicle by Hartmann Schedel (1493) or Copernicus's 'De revolutionibus orbium coelestium' today, is thanks to a fortunate set of circumstances. The library neither fell victim to the town fire of 1728, nor was it plundered after the end of the imperial city period.

Later used as a research library and with limited access, the former imperial city library was reopened to the public in 2013 as a modern library museum following renovation work. It is all the more impressive now to walk through the former market hall, with its massive, beamed ceiling, and let your gaze wander over the many historical volumes that fill the shelves, right to the top of the protective glass cube. 'The books are sorted on the shelf by size, for practical reasons' Breitwieser explains. 'It's easier to work with smaller books at the top of the ladder.'

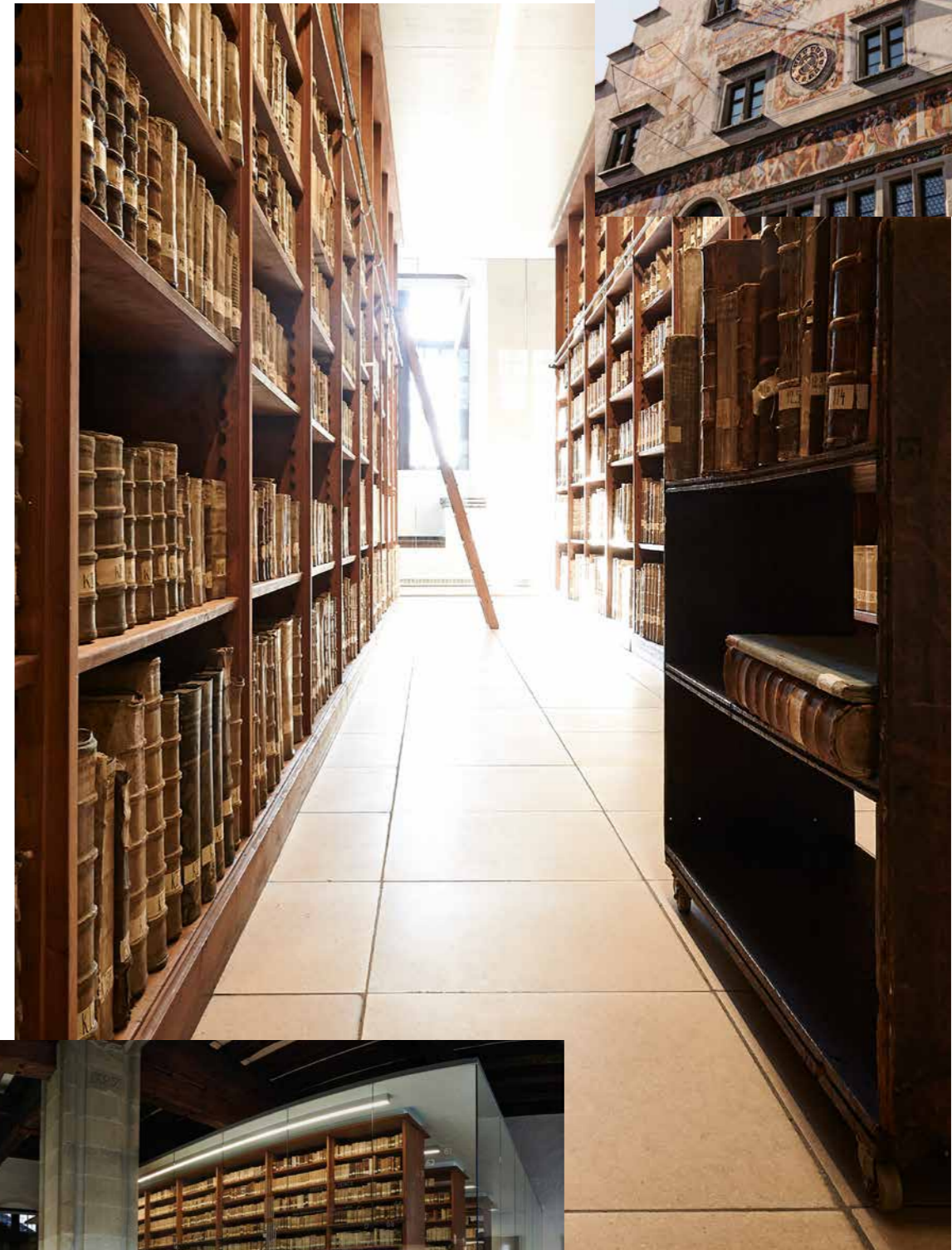
Breitwieser not only ensures the preservation and care of the books, but also answers scientific inquiries and develops varying exhibitions, which bring highlights from the collection to the forefront. In 2026, valuable manuscripts will be on display, including a medical thesis by the Lindau surgeon and ophthalmologist Caspar Stromayr, and one of the few complete manuscripts of the medieval verse novel 'Iwein' by Hartmann von Aue.

'The former imperial city library is truly a project close to my heart, and I am happy when I can show visitors what treasures it holds through the exhibitions,' enthuses Markus Breitwieser. It's a fascination that visitors can easily share when they look at the metres of shelves full of European cultural history, the exciting exhibition pieces or the media show with pictures of particularly beautiful and valuable specimens.

# Cuisine with a Star

Michelin-starred cuisine on Lindau island is something that's been missing for a long time. Julian Karr changed that two years ago when his restaurant 'KARRisma' was awarded with one of the coveted Michelin stars in 2024. 'His cuisine is creative and seasonal, with excellent product quality,' praises the Michelin Guide. What does that taste like? Well, it's best to try it for yourself!

Upon entering KARRisma on Alter Schulplatz, you are greeted by a cosy and relaxed interior that is more reminiscent of an elegant bistro than a classic star restaurant. This is the first indication of Julian Karr's philosophy: 'I want my guests to feel comfortable here – just as they are. They should simply have a wonderful experience in terms of the cuisine, of course, but also due to the overall ambience, the relaxed atmosphere and the special service,' explains the Michelin-starred chef, who not only works his magic in the kitchen, but also serves his creations himself. His special 'Aladdin's lamp' has achieved a certain degree of fame; a sauce boat with an extra-long spout, with which he dispenses the individually desired amount of sauce for each guest at their table.

'For me, sauces are one of the most important things in the kitchen, and there's hardly anything that demonstrates a chef's skills more than mastering them,' Julian Karr asserts. He should know, at the age of eight, he was already working in the kitchen of his parents' restaurant in Langenargen. He completed his training in record time in international Michelin-starred kitchens and, at the age of 25, became the youngest sous-chef in Munich, at the three-star restaurant of Dieter Müller at Schloss Hotel Lerbach. He cooked with greats such as Dieter Koschina in his two-star restaurant in Portugal and, in 2014, he was drawn back to Lake Constance. Three years later he opened KARRisma which has since become a magnet for gourmets.

Julian Karr places a great deal of value on the quality of the ingredients. Every berry, every cucumber, every fish is selected with almost obsessive thoroughness. He also likes to use products from the region such as freshly caught Lake Constance fish, potatoes, beans and tomatoes directly from the farmer, asparagus from Tettwang and, of course, Lake Constance apples, which all find their way into his cooking pots. 'I simply want to cook really well for my guests, and that only works if I use the best ingredients. Only then can I bring together all the flavours that define my culinary style,' Karr stresses.

What does he actually say about now belonging to the ranks of Michelin-starred chefs, like his father once did? 'Of course I'm delighted, and it's a wonderful reward for my work. But much more important to me than making a critic happy once a year is that my guests are enthusiastic about what I do every day. Also, strictly speaking, it was my third star anyway. I've had my first two stars for a few years now, those are my two children,' says Julian Karr with humour and warmth. Guests are also welcome to experience the heartfelt hospitality in his restaurant for themselves, and be enchanted by the flavours of his cooking.

# The Art of Diversity

Since 2025, Lindau has been home to a special attraction: the Hundertwasser Art Forum, which moved into Lindau's art museum and will continue to delight visitors until early 2030, with changing exhibitions featuring the work of the famous Austrian artist, Friedensreich Hundertwasser. The focus is on his unmistakable art, characterised by bold colours and organic forms, as well as his work as an ecological visionary.

The very first exhibition was entitled 'The Right to Dreams' and ran from March 2025 to January 2026, presenting a cross-section of Hundertwasser's work through drawings and original prints. It introduced the future ideas, beliefs and dreams of the artist, who saw himself not only as a painter but also as a driving force behind free and lively architecture and an advocate for nature. A concept that has been well received. Numerous art lovers have since visited the Hundertwasser Art Forum to admire his multifaceted and colourful works and discover the connection between art, architecture and nature that underlies his work.

From spring 2026, the Hundertwasser Art Forum invites visitors to explore Hundertwasser's diverse graphic work. The exhibition 'The Art of Diversity' uses printing blocks, proofs, documentary photographs and a film created especially for the exhibition to provide a deep insight into the creation of his prints. He experimented with various techniques, special pigments and even metal foils, thereby revolutionising the art of printing itself. The breadth of his graphic work is just as evident as his endeavour to create individual works using the reproductive medium of printing, by varying the individual editions.

In the coming year 2027, there will be another new facet of Friedensreich Hundertwasser to discover. The exhibition '100 Years of Hundertwasser – A Visionary' will mark his 100th birthday by focusing on his commitment to environmental protection and his socially critical views. From the concept of green roofs and facades to his own minimalist lifestyle, and the idea of a 'peace treaty with nature', Hundertwasser is more relevant as a visionary today, than ever, and he inspires us to discover more in his art than simply colourful beauty.

## Curator with a Vision – in conversation with Dr. Sophie Sümmermann

Dr. Sophie Sümmermann is an art historian and curator of the Hundertwasser Art Forum. After having organised numerous exhibitions of renowned artists around the world, she has now returned to her hometown of Lindau to design the exhibition programme for Friedensreich Hundertwasser in the new Art Forum.

### What does a curator actually do?

As a curator, I am responsible for everything related to an exhibition. I develop the concept, plan the design of the rooms and the accompanying programme, organise the loans to be displayed, and write the accompanying texts. One of my most important tasks is the decision about the hanging – that is, the placement of the works in the room. For me, the installation is the best moment. When the crates are opened, you see the original works for the first time and carefully unpack them. It feels a bit like Christmas every time – that moment of anticipation and amazement when something you have been planning for so long finally takes shape.

### Friedensreich Hundertwasser is undoubtedly one of the most popular artists of the 20th century. In your opinion, what is the special appeal of his art?

On the one hand, Hundertwasser is impressive with the diversity of his oeuvre, from paintings and original graphics to the buildings created according to his designs. He left a very broad testimony of his work. On the other hand, his fascinating visual worlds are an easily accessible form of art that also inspires children and young people. Finally, his commitment to environmental protection and a liveable future is more relevant than ever.

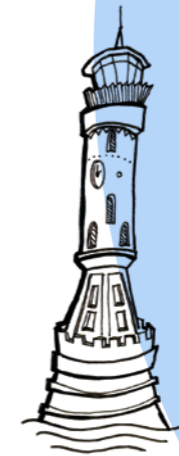
### The exhibition 'The Art of Diversity' is dedicated to Hundertwasser's original graphics from spring 2026 onwards. What characterises his graphic work?

Hundertwasser enormously developed printmaking as an art form, through his use of unusual materials such as phosphorescent colours, metal pigments or glass bead dust, as well as his frequent use of complex printing techniques. He was the first European artist to collaborate with Japanese woodcarvers for his colour woodcuts, creating unique original graphics that were noteworthy for their creative execution, technical sophistication and a lightness reminiscent of his early watercolour paintings. As a 'glimpse into his studio', the exhibition 'The Art of Diversity' shows his working process as well as the resulting diverse artworks, an exciting combination that is definitely worth seeing. As Hundertwasser himself said: 'With printmaking, I enter a paradise that the painter's brush can no longer reach.'

After the bride and groom have tied the knot in the Mang Tower, the celebrations can continue in the Gunpowder Tower on the western tip of Lindau island. The building, built in 1508, was once used as a defensive tower and gunpowder store, hence its name, and later served as the summer residence of the mayor. After a loving restoration, the Gunpowder Tower is back to its former glory and welcomes your wedding party with a successful blend of history and modern comfort. On the ground floor is a cloakroom, bar and a fully equipped kitchen, which allows for catering to be tailored to individual requirements. The tower room on the upper floor, which is adorned with wall and ceiling paintings as well as carvings, can accommodate up to 40 people. Here, in historic surroundings, you can celebrate in style, be it with an exclusive dinner, an elegant champagne reception, or simply – as in the days of the Lindau mayor Dr. Heinrich Schützinger – with a lively get-together. ### **New Lighthouse**

The New Lighthouse is generally open to the public from March to October. For marriage proposals, it can be booked exclusively, and then you and your loved one will have the tower platform with its magnificent panoramic view all to yourselves.

### **Mang Tower**

You can also pop the question to your loved one in the fairytale-like Mang Tower – or even say 'I do.' Civil weddings are offered on selected dates, and the tower room with a capacity for 25 people, can also be used for informal ceremonies or wedding photo shoots.

# A trip on two wheels

**They still exist, the ‘small but mighty’ bike tours, where you can enjoy yourself and become immersed in a region where concepts like ‘sustainability’ and ‘regionality’ are part of day-to-day life. Such an experience is possible on the ‘Truly Sustainable Adventure Tour’.**



The train station in Wasserburg is a good starting point for the 27km loop. From there, we follow the signs in a clockwise direction and cycle through a particularly picturesque, gently rolling landscape with many orchards and vineyards. Along the way we can read interesting facts on the topics of sustainability and regionality on attractively designed information boards. Organic farming is common here. The small, beautiful, Roman Catholic Antonius Chapel in the municipality of Selmnau is a good place for the first short break. The view of Lake Constance and the foothills of the Alps is captivating. From here, a fine gravel path leads us through shady sections of forest towards the Schleinsee lake. The flora and fauna here are healthy, the forest and the meadows well-maintained.

Nature conservation and consideration for regional values are becoming increasingly important nowadays. On the ‘Truly Sustainable Adventure Tour’ these topics are consciously addressed, for example directly at the idyllic Schleinsee lake at the farm of the same name. Guests can help feed the animals and muck out the stables. Some children encounter sheep, cows and donkeys for the first time in their lives. Many products are grown or produced on site, and the cakes and snacks are delicious.

Cycling here, in the midst of such a beautiful landscape, is good for the soul. We stop, again and again. We stroll through organic orchards and pause at wineries to look at the splendidly thriving vines.



For wine lovers, the ‘Weingut 2H’ winery regularly offers various events and tastings. Only vines from particularly fungus-resistant varieties are grown here.

Passing the beautiful Degersee, a moraine lake, we ride through slightly hilly, flower-strewn meadows in a large loop back south towards our starting point. Before we reach Wasserburg again, we marvel at the concept of ‘Little Bee Fresh’, a charming manufacturer of beeswax products.

Back in Wasserburg, our ‘good for the soul’ day trip ends on the shore of Lake Constance. What makes this ‘Truly Sustainable Adventure Tour’ so special is not only the lovely stops along the route, but above all the peaceful and beautiful landscape, with all its special scents. The loop is family-friendly and of course also suitable for e-bikers.

Former police officer and air rescue paramedic, Thomas Widerin, discovered his passion for cycle touring at the age of 43 – inspired by a television report about the Race Across America – and has since completed numerous ambitious solo cycling projects including two crossings of North America as well as tours from Tyrol to the North Cape, and to Paris and Rome.

In his most recent project ‘Long Way Home’, he cycled alone from Alaska to Austria. He has written three books about his adventures and also reports regularly on his online blog.

# Colourful Town



*In recent years, Lindau has been swept by a new wave of creativity. Where once grey walls dominated, vibrant works of art now glow with colour, created with both brushstrokes and spray cans. One of the driving forces behind this transformation is the association 'Kultur und Musik ohne Profit' (Culture and Music without Profit), or KUMOP for short, which since 2020 has been bringing not only music, but also visual art into the town, gradually turning Lindau into a more colourful and lively place.*

With three electricity substation buildings, Lindau's utilities company provided the first stone canvases on which talented graffiti artists from Lindau, Leipzig, and Berlin were able to express themselves freely. The once drab transformer houses were transformed into real eye-catchers and were enthusiastically received by the people of Lindau. 'Our aim was, on the one hand, to turn grey into colour and cheer up the townscape, but also, true to our association's motto, to create an art experience that is free and easily accessible to everyone' explains Moritz Grättinger from KUMOP. 'The response to the street art works shows us that our idea is being well-received, not only by local

residents, but also by Lindau's businesses and institutions, which have since provided us with even more wall space to beautify.'

With the involvement of artists from the region, from across Germany and even from Canada, what began as a simple idea has grown into a town-wide project. The motifs of the street art works are always inspired by the town itself, its surroundings, and, of course, the individual building. They can be discovered delightfully on a walk, offering, at the same time, a wonderful way to explore the Lindau mainland.

- 1.** The walk begins at Sina-Kinkelin-Platz. Here, the Canadian artist Danae Brisso, known for her colourful and imaginative works, has carried out her first major project in Germany. At its centre is the Bavarian mythical creature, the Wolpertinger. The opened fish offers a glimpse into its inner world. A special feature of the project is that more than 60 children from four workshops left their own creative marks in the lower part of the artwork, helping to shape the piece as a true community creation.



- 2.** The trail continues beneath the Thiersch Bridge, which crosses the railway tracks towards the western side of the island. For the first Lindau Biennale in 2022, Felix Rodewaldt and Thilan Stiller took their inspiration here quite literally, creating a homage with bees and dandelions to the railway tracks as a living habitat for plants and animals.



3. Continuing over the railway embankment to Aeschach's shoreline (Aeschacher Ufer), things take a wilder turn. At the playground at Alpengarten, a tiger and a zebra by Nuremberg-based artist Mavo peer out from the urban jungle.

4. Following the shores of the Kleiner See, the route leads to Karl- Bever-Platz, where the artists JackLack from Stuttgart and Fesa from Munich have taken up their brushes several times. At the transformer house by the coach park, they created a work of art that brings the landscape and nature into the town. The small hut at the front, by the bridge to the island, is inspired by the sailing boats on Lake Constance. The round water house on the other side of the bridge head is decorated with a pike.



5. The tour continues past the Toskana Park towards the district of Reutin. The murals at the pedestrian and cycle underpass beneath the railway highlight two of Lindau's special features. On the walls on the south side, the Canadian artist Caleb Screpnek references Lindau's landmarks, the lighthouse and the lion, creating a playful and humorous take on the island town.

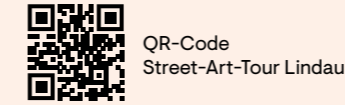
6. Meanwhile, on the north side, Kevin Kandetzki, aka Sokar Uno from Thuringia, has created a homage to the renowned Lindau Nobel Laureate Meetings. The walls feature Nobel Laureates such as Albert Einstein and Marie Curie, among others, as well as a quotation from the Nobel Prize-winning author, Hermann Hesse.



7. Walking along Bleicheweg leads to one of Lindau's most popular street art works, which was also one of the very first: the mural on the theme of hydropower by the Lindau artist Andi Sisic, also known as Moin!, painted on the substation in Reutiner Strasse near Landgasthof Köchlin. The artwork depicts the entire process, from energy generation and distribution, right through to the end consumer.

8. The tour concludes with the residential building at Reutiner Str. 23, whose facade was designed by the artist collective 'Anette Farbe & Andi Wand'. On the large-scale mural, the metamorphosis of a dragonfly larva into an adult insect takes place, going from left to right, which is a reference to Lake Constance as a habitat for animals and plants.

You can get back to the island from the Blauwiese bus stop, or take the opportunity to further explore the mainland side of Lindau while you're here!

# Children's paradise on the Pfänder

**Animals, slides, and exciting games:** with the Pfänder cable car, families soar into hiking heaven. A trip up the mountain holds plenty of surprises, which means lots of activity and a great mood boost.

## Highlights on the mountain

- Panoramic gondola ride with a stunning view
- Watching the boats on the lake from the panorama terrace
- Alpine wildlife park with free admission and circular walking route (approx. 30 minutes to walk around)
- Playground with slide, climbing frame, rocking rides and basket swing
- Bungee trampoline (operates in summer only)
- Forest slide

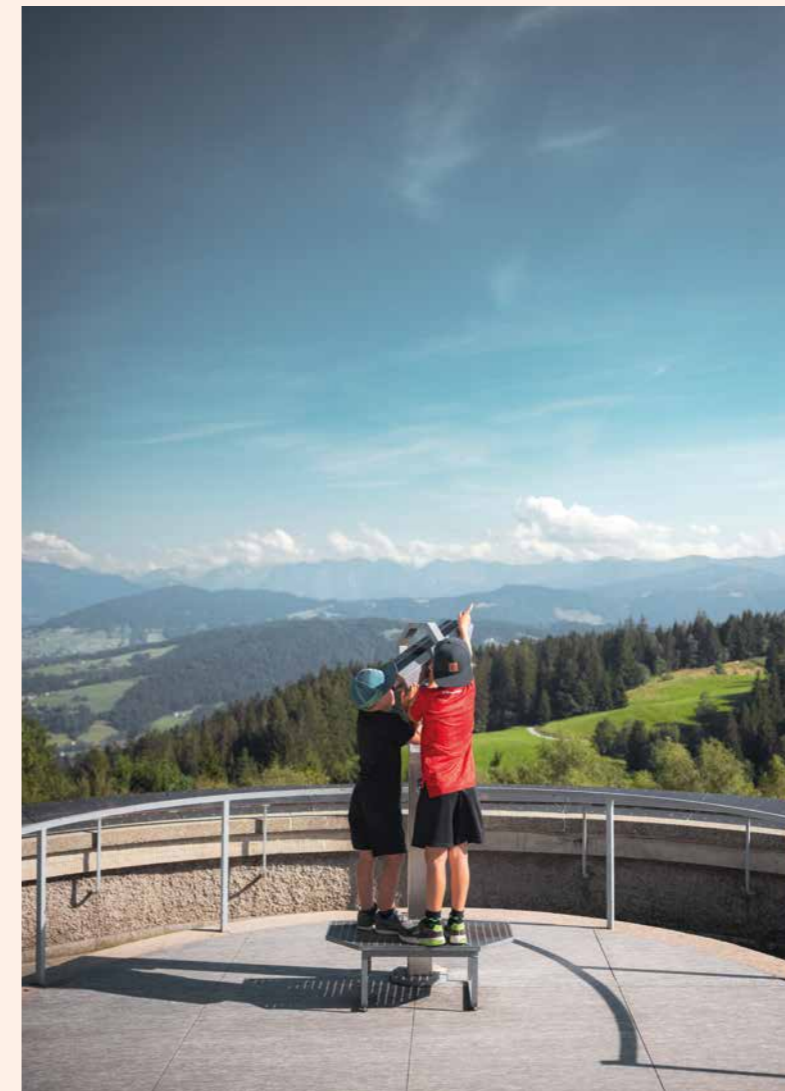
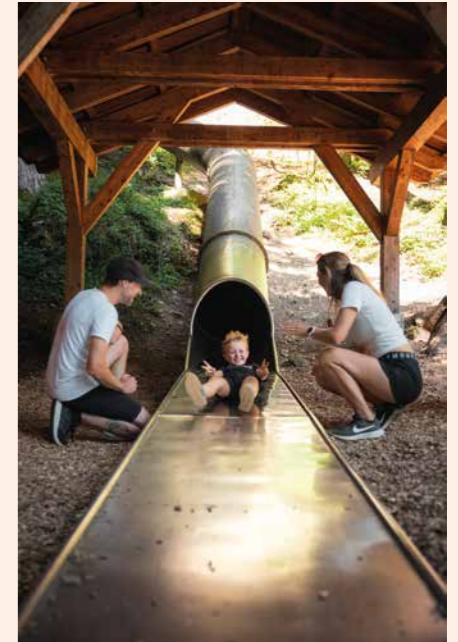
This excursion, full of variety, begins at the cable car base station. In the entrance area, children can play in a wooden gondola until the panoramic cable car arrives. Then it's straight up the mountain, where along the way, guests are offered a breathtaking view of Lake Constance. Those who can't get enough of it can linger even longer on the panorama terrace up at the top. Right next door, the next highlight awaits: the children's playground with swings, climbing frame and slide. Just a few steps further is a viewing platform with a telescope and a rotating puzzle that explains the animal, plant and mountain world. This is also where the first answers to the nature quiz are hidden, which you can either print out at home or pick up at the ticket office. Anyone who answers all the questions correctly is rewarded with a small prize.

The remaining answers can be found by carefully walking through the Alpine Wildlife Park. The admission is free and the entrance is located next to the bungee trampoline (which operates in summer). It's well worth allowing plenty of time for the circular route, as there is so much to discover: pygmy goats, rabbits, ibex, wild boar, mouflon, red deer and ground-hogs. Keep your eyes open, as hidden among the trees near the red deer enclosure is a forest slide. You can run up and slide down again and again until your legs grow tired.

All that activity certainly works up a thirst and an appetite. Fortunately, on the Pfänder there are plenty of places to stop for refreshments.

The area around the upper cable car station is not short of things to do, but you can also extend your visit by exploring one of the many walking trails to and from the Pfänder. Depending on the children's age and fitness levels, there is a choice of short circular hikes as well as longer, more challenging routes. Walking maps are available at the ticket office and on the website. There is also a special map for children showing all the main highlights.

Some advice when planning your visit: on the Pfänder, nature is allowed to remain truly natural. Please note that the paths are not lit at night and are not gritted in winter. Only the immediate area around the upper station is suitable for pushchairs.



## 5 tips for hiking with children

1. The children set the pace and the distance. As a rule of thumb, a hiking time of 1 to 2 hours is sufficient, when on steep paths. For planning, it is best to double the time stated for the route.
2. Wear sturdy footwear that supports the ankles.
3. Include some entertainment. Keep a hiking diary, fill a 'forest jar' with found treasures, walk while playing games and singing songs.
4. Share local legends and stories along the way.
5. Pack plenty of drinks and a small snack, like fruit or muesli bars.

# Sport transcends borders

Every year, Lindau becomes a destination for running enthusiasts. Athletes from all over the world gather to take on their own challenge at the Sparkasse 3-country marathon. The marathon route leads from Germany to Switzerland and back to Austria – three countries that can be run across without border controls.

The course record alone is impressive, but the panorama on the marathon route is every bit as spectacular. Anyone who lifts their gaze from the heels of the runner ahead is rewarded with magnificent views over Lake Constance, over the gentle meadow landscapes of the Rhine Valley and towards the striking Alpine peaks. It's little wonder that the Sparkasse 3-country marathon is now one of the absolute must-haves, or rather must-runs, for many running enthusiasts.

Launched in 2007 with 2,500 participants, the event now attracts around 14,000 runners from 96 nations, who focus on achieving their personal best across a range of disciplines, from children's races and relay events to the half marathon and the full 42.195km distance. This picture-book run along the shore of Lake Constance is truly something special. It makes tangible what is everyday life for many people in the region, the connection between the three neighbouring countries, which have long shared more than just the lake. 'Many participants, especially from countries outside of Europe, are absolutely thrilled that our running event crosses two national borders and demonstrates how sport can bring people of different nations together' explains Dieter Heidegger, co-organiser of the Sparkasse 3-country marathon.

Setting off from beneath the arch at Lindau harbour, the route leads across the lake bridge onto the mainland, where the national border to Austria is crossed at the River Leiblach. The course then continues directly along the shores of Lake Constance, through the grounds of the Bregenz open-air opera stage with its spectacular set design, and on to St. Margrethen in Switzerland, for border crossing number two. With a great atmosphere and music, the spectators give the runners one final boost before they

tackle the final stage, back along the Rhine into Austria, finishing in the 'cauldron' of Bregenz stadium. A real goosebump moment.

'A run without borders also means, for us, treating every participant with the same respect, whether world-class athlete or hobby runner. At the Sparkasse 3-country marathon, everyone is truly a winner' affirms Dieter Heidegger. Alongside the music and party atmosphere lining the course, spectators are also treated to some wonderfully curious sights: runners in chef's attire, cosplay outfits or even traditional wooden clogs from the Bregenz Forest. One standout moment came in 2016, when the artist Bepe Meilenstein completed the route barefoot and in a tailcoat, and backwards, with the finish line on the island. Whether you are a passionate runner or more of an enthusiastic spectator, the next Sparkasse 3-country marathon on 11th October 2026 is definitely a date to mark in red on your calendar. It starts, as always, in Lindau!

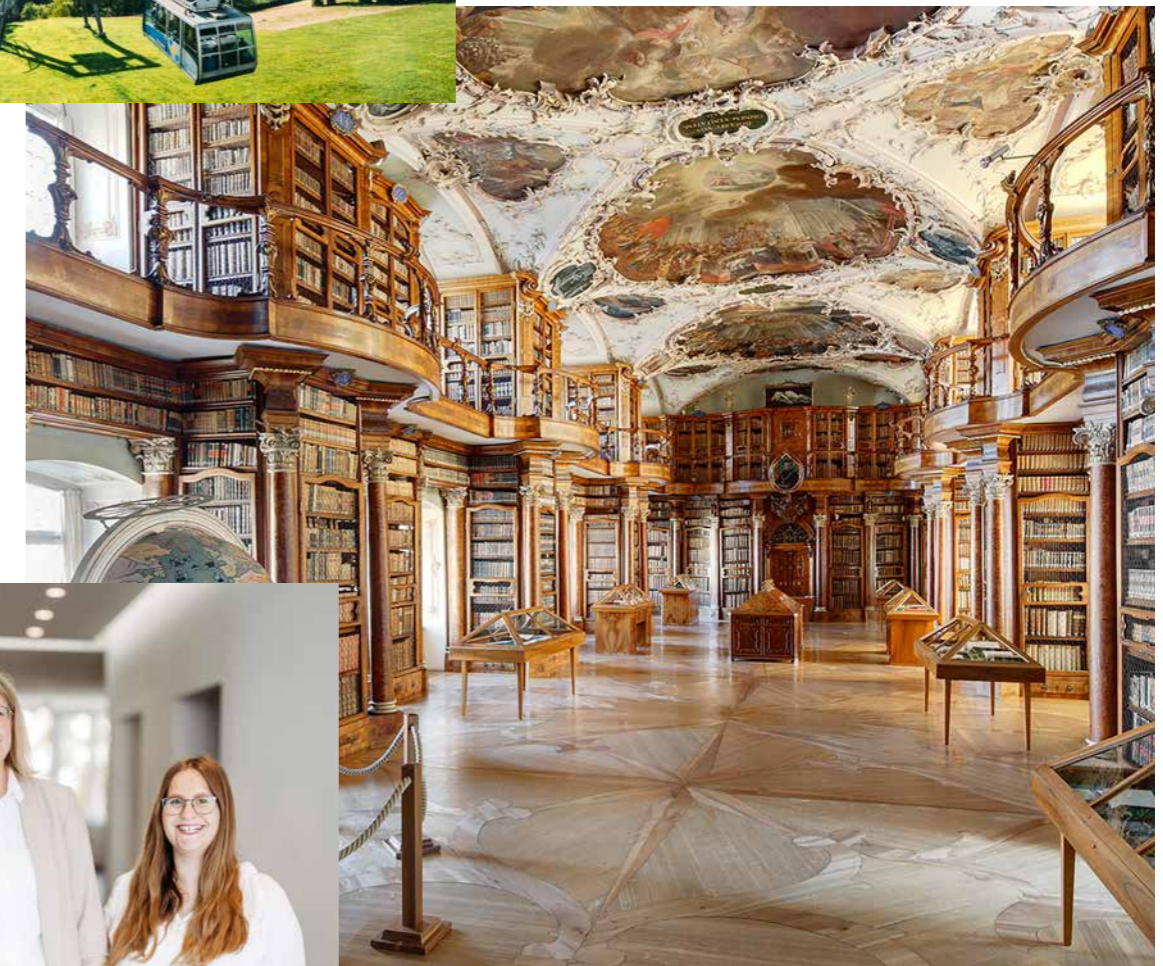

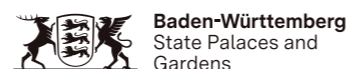
