Würzburg is a city of contrasts. Its significant monuments are testimonies to more than 1,300 years of eventful history and attract culture enthusiasts from all over the world. Yet Würzburg has much more to offer than its fascinating history. The city is vibrant and buzzing with a young population that is shaped by its many students. Stroll

through the streets and take in the Baroque atmosphere, then dance to modern sounds or experience a mix of museums, churches and a vibrant, unconventional cultural scene. From galleries to festivals and trendy bars, Würzburg offers a wide variety of options. It's a historic city with a young vibe that shows you new facets every day.

#SEE

Würzburg's attractions are treasure troves for culture lovers. The Residence – one of the most important Baroque palaces in Europe and a UNESCO World Heritage Site – as well as its court garden are world-famous. Marienberg Fortress, the iconic landmark, towers high above the city. Its history dates back to the 13th century. Veitshöchheim Palace with its Rococo garden is a masterpiece from the era of the prince-bishops. It is well worth visiting – ideally by boat on the river Main.

Würzburg's silhouette is characterized by the towers of around 60 churches and chapels. St. Kilian's Cate-

dral, Neumünster and St. Mary's Chapel are highlights of sacred architecture and important orientation points.



#DISCOVER

The Museum für Franken with its Riemenschneider collection offers insights into Franconian history. Fans of modern art will love the Museum im Kulturspeicher, while sacred art is on display at the Museum am Dom. The Martin von Wagner Museum offers a fascinating overview of art from different eras and cultures. However, it is not only the major museums that shape the city's cultural scene. The Röntgen Memorial Site honors the Nobel Prize winner who worked in Würzburg, and the Jewish Museum Shalom Europa tells the story of the Jewish community.



#EXPERIENCE

The city offers an impressive variety of cultural events throughout the year. At the Mozart Festival, which has been held in Würzburg for over 100 years, internationally renowned artists perform Mozart's works in both festive and unconventional contexts. The Würzburg Bach Days are dedicated to the music of Johann Sebastian Bach. More modern sounds are brought to you by the Würzburg Jazz Festival. Film fans can look forward to cinematic highlights at the International Film Weekend. The Umsonst & Draußen Festival is also popular, offering not only music but also cuisine from around the world. The Würzburger Hafensommer presents open-air concerts on a floating stage next to the Kulturspeicher.





UNESCO WORLD HERITAGE SITE RESIDENCE PALACE

The residence of the Würzburg prince-bishops was built between 1720 and 1744 according to plans by Balthasar Neumann. It is today one of the most important Baroque palace complexes in Europe. The Residence is surrounded by the Court Garden, and the entire complex has been a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1981. The guided tour starts in the Garden Hall and then takes you to the impressive grand staircase. Marvel at the enormous dome and the unique, 677 m² ceiling fresco by the Venetian artist G.B. Tiepolo. Then wander through the White Hall and the beautiful stuccowork by Antonio Bossi to the Imperial Hall.

MARIENBERG FORTRESS


Fortress Marienberg is visible from seemingly everywhere and is the symbol of the city of Würzburg as well as a testimony to more than 1000 years of history. Despite construction work, the second courtyard, the so-called Echterhof, and the viewing points around the castle remain accessible. The moat offers a magnificent view of the old town. The regular guided tours of the castle continue to take place and provide an insight into the eventful history of the fortress.

PALACE VEITSHÖCHHEIM

The summer palace of the Würzburg prince-bishops is located in one of the most important rococo gardens in Germany. The prince-bishops' living quarters and the guest apartment on the upper floor are particularly worth seeing. These rooms can only be visited as part of a guided tour. There is an exhibition on the history of the rococo gardens on the first floor, which can be visited without a guided tour.

MARTIN VON WAGNER MUSEUM (UNIVERSITY OF WÜRZBURG)

The Martin von Wagner Museum is one of the largest university museums in all of Europe. It houses art spanning five millennia and attracts both laypeople and scholars alike. Embark on a journey through 5,000 years of art and cultural history: from ancient Egypt through Greek, Etruscan, and Roman art, the Middle Ages, Renaissance, Baroque, and Neoclassicism, all the way to the modern era – Western art can be experienced here in rare completeness. On Sundays, members of the student “Museum Initiative” offer guided tours on exciting topics that change weekly (in German).

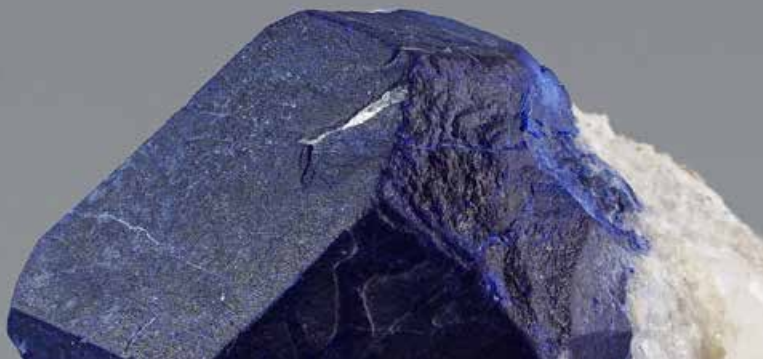

RÖNTGEN MEMORIAL

In 1895, Wilhelm Conrad Röntgen discovered x-rays in Würzburg – a groundbreaking discovery that is an integral part of medicine, technology and research today. In 1901, he received the first Nobel Prize in Physics from the Royal Swedish Academy of Sciences. Röntgen's original laboratory is now home to the Röntgen Memorial with various original exhibits and replicas of the equipment used at the time. The focus is not only on Röntgen's research and technology – you get a feeling for his life and his person here.

SIEBOLD MUSEUM

The Würzburg doctor Philipp Franz von Siebold is regarded as the founder of research on Japan. He lived in Japan for several years, at a time when the country was largely isolated. The permanent collection of the Siebold Museum includes exhibits from his estate. There is also an original Japanese teahouse and a Japanese reference library to marvel at. The museum presents temporary exhibitions, cultural events and lectures, Ikebana and origami courses and tea ceremonies.

LÜGENSTEINMUSEUM WÜRZBURG


The museum presents the story of the infamous “lying stones” – one of the most spectacular scientific forgeries of all time – in an interactive and exciting way. The approximately 2,000 mysterious figurative stones started heated debates in the 18th century, at the time of the residence’s construction: nature or art?

For the first time, all the stones located outside Würzburg have been reunited – as replicas or rediscovered originals from the world-famous collection – just in time for the 300th anniversary of their first illustration. The ideal occasion to go in search of clues in baroque Würzburg.

Contemporary artists exhibit their works in a late Gothic chapel renovated in 1789 in early Classicism style. Twelve exhibitions a year present contemporary paintings and sculptures, photography and applied art. In addition, the VKU offers a diverse cultural program with concerts and film evenings, readings and discussions with the artists.
